COME AND JOIN US IN BALI!

An invitation from IIAS, IASIA and the National Institute of Public Administration, Indonesia

We have the honour and pleasure to invite you to Bali, Indonesia to attend the 28th International Congress of Administrative Sciences from 12-17 July 2010. As a growing centre for business and tourism in South-East Asia, Indonesia provides delegates with a unique blend of tradition, modern life and sincere hospitality. Bali, the island of gods and temples, is one of the world's most beautiful islands, renowned for its hospitality, beauty, and conference facilities.

Two main themes will be addressed during the Congress:

- The IIAS theme - *"Public Administration Facing New Dynamics: constraints, innovation and sustainability"* – at the forefront of current interest worldwide, will be discussed in a broad forum which will attract new participants from all countries of the world as well as from the Region and including all bodies concerned by issues related to the theme. The emphasis will be on bearing witness to real experiences that have occurred and on illustrating how difficulties have been overcome.
- The IASIA theme - *"Public Sector Strategies for Overcoming Growing Global Inequality"* - is a particularly critical one. It addresses the issue of growing inequality around the world and what government can and cannot do to address the problem. The fact that over the past quarter century in most parts of the world the number of people living in absolute poverty has actually increased is not simply the consequence of a globalizing world. Rather, this is the consequence of public policies - pursued or not pursued - by governments worldwide. The way in which governments choose to raise their revenue (more or less progressively) and the way in which they distribute the resources purchased with that revenue, as well as the manner in which they regulate their private sectors, all impact on issues of inequality and poverty within a society. In addition to issues related directly to the theme, as well as the themes to be discussed by IASIA's 8 Working Groups, several plenary sessions and special sessions on a variety of topics will be organized.

In Bali, we hope that you and your colleagues, together with other participants from around the world, will be able to join us to discuss these critical and challenging issues.

IIAS THEME

Public Administration Facing New Dynamics: constraints, innovation and sustainability

Prof Dr Andi Fetta Wijaya, MPA, PhD, lecturer from Brawijaya University shall be responsible for the scientific preparation of this event.

He will be assisted by a team of three Rapporteurs: Shri Prabhas Kumar Jha (Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances, India), Dr Muhammad Taufiq (Graduate from Iep Bordeaux University, France and lecturer School of Public Administration, Indonesia) and Luis García Cárdenas (Head of International Relations, National Institute of Public Administration, Mexico).

The following subthemes will be addressed:

- 1. Re asserting public action: Roles and Responsibilities**
- 2. Renewing State Protection for Citizens and Society: Values and Responses**
- 3. Handling the Legacy: Conditions, Constraints and opportunities**

IASIA THEME

Public Sector Strategies for Overcoming Growing Global Inequality

The Rapporteur for IASIA will be Mr Bernard Boucault, Director of the prestigious French National School of Administration (ENA).

There will be three plenary sessions organized. The opening plenary session will focus on the theme of "Public Sector Strategies for Overcoming Growing Global Inequality". In the second plenary session speakers and cabinet ministers from Indonesia and the region will address issues of equality and inequality from an Asian point of view. In the third plenary session the IASIA committee on the Implementation of the UN/IASIA Standards of Excellence will present its report and findings.

In addition we will again have a workshop on "How to Get Published" as well as organize our traditional "Forum for Regional and National Organizations" and the "Forum for Heads of National Schools and Institutes of Public Administration". In five parallel regional workshops participants can discuss issues in Public Administration relevant to the region of their interest and a special panel session will focus on transparency and accountability.

Last but not least, IASIA's 8 Working Groups will convene during the Congress:

- I. Education and Training Programme: aligning missions and quality
- II. State-Market Partnerships and Enterprise Management
- III. Public Sector Reform: people in the public service
- IV. Local Governance and Development

- VII. Leadership, Governance and Public Policy
- VIII. Management of Energy, Food Security and Welfare
